Women mechanics, gasoline station attendants, and some industrial workers need a one-piece coverall for their work. The suit shown here is designed for complete freedom of action. Gathers are set in below a shallow back yoke and short sleeves are loosely styled to allow arm freedom. Darts below the waistline and a boxed crotch give the needed bending room.

For easy dressing the front placket is long and closed with a slide fastener which leaves no gaps that might catch. Safety fasteners also close the back drop and the leg openings. The belt fits close about the waist and supports the back drop. If it should catch, the snap-fastened sliding buckle will unfasten and so prevent injury to the wearer or damage to the suit.

Shaped-in trouser legs do not collect soil and there is no danger of tripping.

Grocery bag pockets on the waist and hip hold a purse and other small articles. Snap fasteners make them safe - even though the work requires bending, nothing will fall out of the pockets.

An adjustable cap with visor completes the suit for work that requires protection of the hair and eyes. It can be opened out flat for ironing, then adjusted to proper fit with the aid of a snap buckle.

Soft quality denim, gabardine, or covert are suggested materials for this coverall because they are sturdy and wash well.
