

An Ordinance, to prevent filth from entering
into the Hydraulic Works of the Chicago
Hydraulic Company from Lake Michigan

Be it ordained by the Common Council
of the City of Chicago that no person or
persons shall hereafter drive ~~or lead~~ ^{or drive} any
horse, or horses, or other animal into
Lake Michigan at the East end of
Lake Street, in said city (or between the
Hydraulic Works of said Company, and
the South pier, for the purpose of washing
or cleaning said horse or horses or other
animal. Nor shall any person or persons
wash or clean any carriage or
~~other~~ vehicle whatever, within said
limits, or cause the same to be done

Any person, who shall violate
any provision of the foregoing ordinance
shall forfeit to the City of Chicago the penalty
of Ten Dollars, to be collected before
any Justice of the Peace, or Court having
jurisdiction thereof;
