Whereas the Fugitive Slave Act, recently passed by Congress, is re= volting to our moral sense, and an outrage upon our feelings of jus= tice and humanity, because it desregards all the securities which the Constitution and Laws have thrown around personal liberties, and its direct tendency is to alienate the people from their love and reve= rence for the Government and Institutions of our Country — therefore;

Resolved, That as the Supreme Court of the United States has solemn= ly adjudged that State Officers are under no obligations to fulfil duties imposed upon them, as such Officers, by any Act of Congress, we do not therefore consider it a part of our duty, or the duty of the City Officers of the City of Chicago, to aid or assist in the arrest of fugitives from oppression; and by withholding such aid or assisstance we do not believe that our "Harbour appropriations will would be withheld," "our Rail Roads injured," our Commerce destroyed"— or "treason would be committed against our Government."
