Chiropractic medicine is a branch of health care that focuses on treating patients without the use of drugs or surgery. This profession advocates a holistic philosophy, which emphasizes prevention and wellness over treating disease and injury. Chiropractic physicians are trained in diagnosis and treatment of diseases of all body systems with a concentration in the nervous and musculoskeletal systems. In addition to the classroom instruction there are additional internships and preceptorships that lead to the completion of the doctorate degree. Following completion of the necessary doctorate course work and internships, the student will be expected to take the National Board Exam. Individual states differ in their licensing requirements.

Chiropractic education programs require at least 3 years of undergraduate education, and most require a bachelor's degree. Undergraduate studies must include a prescribed number of prerequisite courses, as defined by the Council on Chiropractic Education (CCE), an accrediting agency of the US Department of Education.

STANDARD ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must have completed 90 semester hours or the equivalent of three academic years of undergraduate study at an institution accredited by a U.S. Department of Education agency or an equivalent foreign agency.
- Grade point average (GPA) must be at least 3.0 or greater on a 4.0 scale.
- 90 hours includes a minimum of 24 semester hours in life and physical science courses which provide an adequate background for success in the doctor of chiropractic program (DCP). At least half of these courses will have a substantive laboratory component.
- An applicant's undergraduate preparation must also include a wellrounded general education program in the humanities and social sciences, and other coursework deemed relevant by the DCP for students to successfully complete the DCP curriculum.
- Chiropractic education programs have rolling admissions throughout the year and operate on semesters, trimesters and quarters. Check with the program in which you are interested to learn more about its specific academic requirements, course curriculum, and admission deadlines.

EIU offers all the prerequisite courses for entrance to chiropractic school.
