for various leisure service agencies throughout the state.

In addition to teaching, I co-authored two articles for the journal of *Public Personnel Management* titled, "The development of a pay-for-performance appraisal system for municipal agencies" (in press) and "The development of a model for the distribution of merit pay increase monies for municipal agencies" (in press). I also presented a session during the 2009 IPRA/IAPD Annual Conference (Chicago, IL). More recently, I am working with the NRPA and the American Academy of Park and Recreation Administrators

on the development of a white paper that focuses on the impact the recent economic downturn has had on urban public parks and recreation agencies, non-urban special districts (i.e., park districts, forest preserve districts, etc.), and municipal departments. The intent of this white paper is to not only summarize the effects of this economic downturn, but provide public park and recreation agencies with recommendations and examples of best practices for managing their agencies during this time of uncertainty.

I continue to work on creating additional application-based activities for my courses as well as my research and service lines. If you or your agency has any ideas, I would love to hear from you. Have a happy winter and spring season!

## Annual EIURAAA Student Forum

The 11<sup>th</sup> Annual EIURAA Student Forum was held on Friday, October 13<sup>th</sup>. The opening session, *Passion and Compassion*, was given by LoriKay Paden, Office of Recreation and Park Resources, University of Illinois. Ms. Paden also presented a session entitled *BTW, Professionalism Still Matters, LOL*. Edward Gudas from Lake Forest Parks and Recreation discussed *Get Out to Stand Out - Outdoor Recreation and Adventure Programming*. *Club Med and Small town Park Districts* was led by Mose Ricky from Roselle Park District.
