Bob began his professional career in 1984 with the Morton Grove Park District where he was an Athletic Supervisor and then Superintendent of Recreation Facilities. He also held a position with northwest DuPage Special Recreation Association Center serving as the Director of marketing and Development. He then became director of Parks and Recreation for Havana Park District. His distinguished career with the Munster Park District began in 1997 when he assumed the position of superintendent of Recreation. His next position was that of Director of Parks and Recreation.

His accomplishments include over a million dol-

lars in grants for building of a bike/pedestrian path and riverwalk construction. He supervised the development of a 200 acre park, oversaw the construction of the 2.6 million dollar Munster Community pool, and was the founder of the Munster Parks and Recreation Car Show.

Mr. O'Shaughnessy received his B.S. in Recreation Administration in 1983 and received the William G. Riordan award in 1983. Bob has been actively involved in both Indian and Illinois Park and Recreation Associations, has been an active board member of the Rotary Club, and is a Junior Achievement Instructor.

What a busy 2011 fall semester it has been! In the summer the faculty began looking at the tasks related to the upcoming accreditation process for the department. The new standards give us many aspects to track and measure related to student outcomes in the various courses we provide. Then, in summer, I also revised the entire Therapeutic Recreation curriculum based on both the standards from the American Therapeutic Recreation Association (ATRA) and the newly formed Council on Therapeutic Recreation Education (CARTE). Students now need to complete 5 TR content courses and still many Recreation courses. I feel strongly committed to the idea that Therapeutic Recreation/ Recreation Therapy must be based in Recreation

and Leisure Behavior theory and paradigms. Our TR students will be busy and will need to complete 124 hours in order to graduate. The courses and curriculum changes went through the various levels of the university approval process throughout the fall and are now official! We will have the changes up on the department website fairly soon.

We have also been seeing an increase in the number of TR majors- and have had students who have visited from Kentucky and Indiana- we hope they will join the department and welcome all of our newcomers. And, congratulations to one of our TR students, Victoria Trebels. She won, along with 5 oth-

er students, a scholarship to attend the ILRTA Fall Conference. She had a great learning experience and met many new practitioners and other students at the Chicago 3 day meeting.

I have also been busy in many roles tied to our professional organizations: ILRTA Board Member, ATRA Research Foundation Member, and Book Co-editor for the Therapeutic Recreation Journal. These obligations have had me going to several conferences this semester. They have been stimulating and are the best avenues to hear the discussions about the many variables affecting Higher Education, therapeutic recreation and the general recreation field in

In the Finance course, students were giv-

en the opportunity to develop business plans and budgets for a new product, business, or program. -hand the role and impact of research in a “real-life” setting that culminated with students presenting the results of the two studies to Findlay Long-Term Improvement Program board members. A practicum experience was developed within the Operations course through partnerships with the Mattoon YMCA (Tony Sparks & Blake Fairchild), Campus Recreation (Ken Baker), and Charleston Parks & Recreation (Brian Jones, Diane Ratliff, and C.J. Applegate). In particular, each student selected one of the three agencies and spent 12 hours with the agency where the professionals provided application-based experiences that were directly aligned with the content discussed within the Operations course. The intent of this experience was to further connect the classroom discussions with the actual field setting. This was an exciting and, at times, “eye-opening” experience for students with some even securing future internships with their agency as a result of their efforts!

In addition to teaching, I have authored two articles – one for the *Journal of Park & Recreation Administration* (“The role of family-friendly benefits on job self-efficacy and organizational commitment of public park and recreation professionals”) and one for the *Illinois Park & Recreation* magazine (“Family-friendly employee benefits programs in Illinois park districts”). The textbook I co-authored with a colleague (Ryan Gower, University of Illinois), “Making the most of your internship: A strategic approach”, is scheduled for distribution in the spring (2012) through Sagamore Publishing. I am also working with Amy Hurd (Illinois State University) on the 4th edition of the “*Official study guide for the certified park and recreation professional examination*”

book that is scheduled for distribution in the summer (2012). Finally, I presented two sessions at the 2011 NRPA Congress (Atlanta, GA) and one at the 2011 Indiana Parks and Recreation Association Conference (Indianapolis, IN).

nance, Charleston]. To compliment this depth of institutional knowledge, as a class we became regulars in the Gregg Technology Lab classroom as we worked through multiple programs and exercises to produce quality concept plans and become more acquainted with facility-related demands in today's technology-rich workplace.

In Outdoor Living Skills, we played whirly-boat [an original watercraft navigation game] on the campus pond, hiked, canoed and kayaked at Lake Charleston, and built fires and hiked at Fox Ridge State Park. Probably the most memorable experience was a bicycle tour to Walnut Point

State Park, where the class camped for the evening. Riding twenty-six miles from McAfee Gymnasium to the campground at Walnut Point was an adventure to be sure, as was the return trip.

Through this experience the students learned a lot about each other, themselves, their interests and abilities related to outdoor recreation along with the importance of preventative decision-making in outdoor adventure and recreation.

Like my courses, my service activities have focused on the administration and provision of leisure services. My University service activities have included serving as chair of the CEPS social committee and co-advising the Recreation Majors Club along with Dr. Mulvaney.
