As Provost, Dr. Gatrell works with the Deans of the Academic Colleges (Education, Business & Technology, Booth Library, Graduate School, Health & Human Services, Honors, and Liberal Arts & Sciences,) to deliver high quality, mission centered undergraduate and graduate student experiences.

Additionally, the Provost & Vice President for Academic Affairs oversees critical student and faculty support structures that include - Academic Success Center (Advising, Disability Services, Testing & Assessment, and Student Success), Enrollment Management (Admissions, Registrar, Financial Aid, and Marketing & Digital Branding), Inclusion & Academic Engagement, and the Faculty Development & Innovation Center.

Finally, as EIU's Chief Academic Officer Dr. Gatrell also has primary responsibilities for coordinating campus accreditation processes, curriculum development, program assessment, and external academic program relations.

From the EIU student's perspective, the role of the EIU Provost & Vice President for Academic Affairs is a critical one responsible for working collaboratively with EIU Faculty to shape academic policies and procedures through the process of shared governance. Additionally, the VP is responsible for maintaining the integrity of academic programs through the consistent and fair enforcement of university policies and management of various student appeals process.
