- IX. Speaker Report Michael Perri

- a. Office Hours: The Speaker started by talking about the Office Hours requirement for all Senators which is 2 hours every week and senators could potentially do up to an hour outside the office. Office hours were said to be due at 5pm every Wednesday and during this time Senators could work on putting out marketing, talking to other students and asking their opinions, event planning, research and Legislation drafting. For the time being, Senators were told to read up on their binders and help with putting out marketing.
- b. Committees: The speaker handed out a sheet so the Senators could fill out their top three choices for Committee placements and he emphasized the fact that no committee is greater of more important that the other. He also talked about the benefits one could gain from applying to be a Committee chair and that interviews for those will be taking place during the week and the applications were on the table.
- c. Headshots: Handouts were passed around and filled and the senators were asked to return those to the Speaker by the end of the night. He also added that senators need to stay behind to take pictures for their headshots.
- d. 'Your Campus, Your Voice" Initiative: The Speaker talked about this new tabling initiative and reemphasized the purpose of the program which included getting student feedback, continuous recruitment for committees and senate seats, promoting upcoming events, and to generally establish a presence on campus so the student body sees the Senate as being representative of them. Dates for this event were said to be tentative.

X. Executive Reports

- a. Student Body President Carson Gordon
 - i. Small Talk: Student Body President Gordon started out by asking everyone why they chose to come to EIU and a lot of responses were based on Financial and sentimental.
 - ii. Sexual Violence Prevention Team: President Gordon talked about meeting with this team September 9th and some of the things they discussed included coming up with consent posters and potential ideas for events over the course of the semester, she also added that the nest meeting would be on the 23rd of September.
 - iii. EIU Naming Committee: The president mentioned that this committee met on the 3rd of September and that they discussed potentially naming a suite in O'Brien after a family that donated a huge amount of money towards the remodeling of the space.
 - iv. Goals for the Semester: President Gordon listed out some of the things that she hopes to achieve during the course of the semester

- 2. Finish planning Mental Health Awareness week with student athletes who are very involved with their governing bodies.

- 6. Helping with the Your Campus, Your Voice Initiative.
- b. Executive Vice President Kathleen Conlin
 - i. EIU Votes: EVP Conlin informed that the registration to vote dates will be on the 24th and 26th of September FROM 11:00am till 2:00pm at Taylor hall and on the 1st and 3rd of October in Coleman Hall from 11:00am till 2:00pm. Volunteers were said to be needed for this event and so all senators were encouraged to ask at their other RSOs for volunteers. In addition to that, EVP Conlin mentioned that she will be meeting with a representative of the Political Science Association and that anyone who volunteers will be featured in a video. She passed around a sign-up sheet for anyone that wanted to volunteer.
 - ii. Board of Trustees: The Vice President informed the Senate that she attended her first BoT meeting on the 13th of September and one of the things they talked about was the 3.7% increase in enrollment and the passing of the new Nursing Program and Masters in both Exercise Physiology and Sport Administration all of which would help keep students in the institution and potentially attract new students. The last thing voted on was the naming of the victory Suite as the Schnorf Family victory Suite.
 - iii. Upcoming Plans: EVP Conlin updated the senate about her plans moving forward which included
 - 1. Continuing work on the EIU Votes initiative
 - 2. Attending the next Board of Trustees workshop in Bloomington on the 28th of September.
 - 3. Starting work on Student Action Team by updating the applications and reaching out to the Lobbyist to potential schedule a meet-up with the members of the SAT.

- c. Vice-President of Academic Affairs Noor-ul-Haash Khamisani

- i. Student Deans: VP Khamisani informed the senate that she has successfully filled all the positions of Student Dean. For all four colleges.

- ii. Prowlin with the Prez VP Khamisani talked about her first Prowlin event of the semester and said that although there was an okay turnout, it could have could have been better and having more members of the senate present and helping with marketing leading up to the event.

Their next meeting was said to be on the 9th of September.

- d. Vice-President of Student Affairs Samira Abdoulaye Pedila
 - i. Student Involvement Fair- VPSA Abdoulaye Pedila mentioned that it had been a while since the Student Involvement Fair formerly known as Panther Palooza was held outside and so that in itself was a welcome change, and she went over the responses that she got from attending RSOs about the event. In general, the responses were said to have been positive with some remarks about the weather conditions and the fact that the tables could have been spaced better.
