

### A Busy Summer for New Student & Family Programs

Summer 2021 New Student Orientation can be checked off the to-do list for the New Student & Family Programs Office. Being able to offer the choice of an in-person Orientation as well as a virtual Orientation was super exciting for our Orientation Leaders as well as Tanya Willard, Director NSFP, and Beth Dunahee, Assistant Director, NSFP.

Willard explained that several of the Orientation Leaders were rising sophomores who themselves were not able to experience an in-person Orientation last year and she was exceptionally proud of the way they handled themselves answering questions all day, even during a tornado warning. Whether in-person or virtual, each half day Orientation was a mixture of fun and facts. New to Orientation this year was a Family Expert Panel made up of faculty and staff parents of EIU students. Each panel session answered a multitude of questions about what it is really like from an EIU parents' perspective. Families wrapped up the day by writing their student a Family Fan Mail letter to be delivered by NSFP six weeks into the semester.

When asked about the shorter schedule, Willard explained that programming was not being deleted, NSFP was getting smarter about how to present all the information. Students take a campus tour, meet with advisors, register for classes, get their Panther Card, download Panther Life, and learn about life at EIU from our student experts, the Orientation Leaders. "One of the reasons I love Orientation is that it involves so many areas across campus, and it

always amazes me how eager EIU folks are to be a part of this."

Looking forward, Willard would like to incorporate a tour of an EIU classroom into the Orientation schedule. "Having an Orientation Leader deliver a presentation in one of our classrooms would give students a real feel for what it is like to be in a college classroom."

Ahead for NSFP is a departmental move to 1302 McAffee and kicking off the fall semester with Welcome Weekend and then Family Weekend September 17-19.
