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Health Education Resource Center

After spending the last 2 years focused on EIU's Covid-19 testing and response, Emma Noble and the Health Education Resource Center (HERC) team are grateful to be back to a more normal schedule. Noble, Assistant Director of Health Education and Promotion, explained, "While all of our educational efforts took place during COVID, COVID care was first and foremost." Noble added, "All of the efforts we provide hopefully increase our students' self advocacy to be able to be in control of their own health and wellness."

One major event the HERC is promoting is our Flu Shot Clinic. In collaboration with the Coles County Health Department and the EIU Medical Clinic, students, employees, and retirees can receive their flu shots on campus tomorrow, October 26. The HERC helps to educate our EIU family on the importance of WHY to get a flu shot.

In the month of October, the HERC joined with EIU's Living Learning Communities to host bystander intervention events. Self defense, late night Bingo, and Title IX alcohol intervention events took place with a spooky Halloween theme. The LLCs offered more than \$250 in prizes at those events, and the Sexual Assault Counseling and Information Service (SACIS) set up tables at each event. The HERC began working with LLCs last spring by

helping to host Safer Spring Break Bingo.

The HERC is staffed by interns as well as graduate assistants enrolled in the Public Health, Counseling, Communication Studies, and Nutrition programs. Trying to meet our students needs where they are in regard to their health experiences is the main goal. "When we are educating them, we try not to assume where they are on that spectrum," said Noble. "Every student is coming from a different standpoint."

Looking towards the spring semester, the HERC plans on collaborating with SACIS for National Eating Disorders Awareness Week in February and Sexual Assault Awareness Month in April.
