ACS-certified programs meet rigorous national criteria set by the American Chemical Society. Students in Biochemistry supplement their study of the chemistry of living systems with courses in biology. A concentration in Biochemistry can lead to employment in the biotechnology industry or further study in medicine, dentistry, or graduate school. The Chemistry Management concentration prepares students for positions in sales or management within the pharmaceutical or chemical industry where often both chemical and business skills are required. This concentration includes foundation courses that are required for many MBA programs.
