

At least 9 hours must be from courses numbered 3000 or above

#### **NONPHILOSOPHY ELECTIVES – 15 HOURS**

The student must complete 15 hours in an area of concentration from another discipline or disciplines. At least 6 credit hours must be from courses numbered 3000 or above. The student who plans an Option in Integrative Studies must develop a plan in consultation with a faculty member. The plan must be approved by the Philosophy Department Chair.
