EIU TRANSFER STUDENT CHECKLIST

2. VISIT US

- ☐ Visit Eastern and take a tour prior to enrollment. Student-led walking tours are offered Monday Friday at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.
- Visit admissions.eiu.edu or call the Office of Admissions at 217-581-2223 for additional information.
- Schedule an appointment to meet with a transfer counselor for an unofficial credit evaluation.
- Be sure to check out the transfer sessions at one of our Open House programs:

3. APPLY

- Apply early! We begin accepting applications one year prior to enrollment. For an online application, visit eiu.edu/ admissions/applyeiu.php.
- Have final official high school transcript showing date of graduation and/or GED scores sent.
- Have official college transcripts sent from <u>each</u> college attended for admission decision.
- $\hfill \square$ Have updated and final official college transcripts sent.

TRANSFER ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

MUST MEET ONE OF THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

- + 24 OR MORE SEMESTER HOURS:
- 2.0/4.0 overall; AND 2.0/4.0 from last college attended, OR
 + FEWER THAN 24 SEMESTER HOURS:
- 2.0/4.0 overall; AND 2.0/4.0 from last college attended; AND meet the following high school admission criteria:

GPA	and ACT	or	SAT
2.5/4.0	and 18	or	960*

*SAT 860 if taken prior to March 2016

4. FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIPS

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), using last year's taxes, online <u>after Oct. 1 for the</u> <u>next calendar year</u> at fafsa.ed.gov.
- Apply as early as possible to ensure maximum financial assistance.
- ☐ Mid-year transfers call 1-800-4 FED AID.☐ Eastern's Title IV code for FAFSA is 001674.

5. HOUSING

- Once admitted, apply for on-campus housing through your MyEIU account: my.eiu.edu
- If living off campus, begin housing search six to nine months prior to enrollment.

6. CAREER SERVICES


- Once admitted, contact Career Services at 217-581-2412 or eiu.edu/careers to get assistance with major selection, internship placement, job shadowing, resume writing, etc.
- ☐ Begin preparing for the upcoming EIU Job Fair prior to enrollment.

7. REGISTER

- Receive Transfer Orientation invitation via email and sign up online, through MyEIU, for the earliest date possible.
- Online and off-campus majors will be contacted by the Department for advisement and registration.
- Attend Transfer Orientation to meet with an adviser and register for classes the semester before enrollment.
- Visit eiu.edu/nsp for more information.
- Submit final official college transcripts from last institution attended.
- Return Immunization Form (received separately in the mail) to EIU Health Service Office.

8. YOU'RE HERE!

- Move in to residence hall or apartment one week prior to the beginning of classes.
- ☐ Complete Alcohol EDU and Haven requirements.
- Check in and attend part two of orientation the Friday prior to the first day of classes. Online and off-campus students are exempt.
- Pick up textbooks at Textbook Rental Service three days prior to the beginning of classes. Textbooks may be mailed to online and off-campus students.
- Participate in classes, sharing your perspective as a transfer student.
- Get involved and make connections through the many events and organizations on campus.
- Apply for graduation during your junior year to receive a degree audit that includes transfer credit and remaining requirements for degree completion.
