SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Over \$52 million in scholarships and awards were given to EIU students during the 2022-23 school year (more than \$14,000 per student on average).

TRANSFER AUTOMATIC MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

Must have at least 15 credit hours transferred from an accredited college or university.

TIER ONE

GPA: 3.5 - 4.0 - \$5,000* (\$2,500 awarded annually)

TIER TWO GPA: 3.0 - 3.49 - \$3,000* (\$1,500 awarded annually)

*Renewable up to 4 consecutive semesters if renewal criteria is met.

SUCCESS & ENGAGEMENT AWARD

Students who do not meet the above GPA requirements, but showcase leadership and involvement - \$4,000 (\$1,000 awarded annually)

PANTHER PROMISE TUITION WAIVER

Students from households with an annual income ranging from:

\$55,000 TO \$100,000 WILL RECEIVE UP TO \$2,500 towards tuition for up to eight semesters.

EIU PROMISE PROGRAM

EIU will reduce the cost of your remaining tuition and required fees to \$0 if you meet the following criteria:

• YOUR FAMILY'S ANNUAL INCOME IS \$66.000 **OR LESS**

- You have a minimum of a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- You are an Illinois resident
- You have your financial aid packaged and complete by June 1
- You meet all other AIM HIGH Grant requirements

The Panther Pledge offers community college students guaranteed admission to Eastern Illinois University to complete their bachelor's degree.

- Guaranteed Admission
- Easy Transfer Planning
- Early Connection to EIU
- Application fee will be waived

TRANSFER CREDIT

- Eastern accepts all college-level transfer credit with the exception of remedial, developmental, or orientation courses.
- Elective credit will be awarded and applied to total hours toward graduation if there is no equivalency to a course at Eastern.
- Out of state college-level credit will be accepted with the potential to be equivalent to EIU courses. Syllabi, or course descriptions are helpful for department approval.
- EIU is a participant in the Transferology system (www.transferology.com), a free online resource where you can find out how your courses transfer.
- EIU is a full participant in the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI). (www.itransfer.org)
- EIU accepts credit for Nationally Standardized Tests - CLEP, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and UExcel Exams.

A COMPLETE APPLICATION INCLUDES:

- Official college transcripts* from each institution attended.
- If the applicant has fewer than 24 hours of college coursework at the time of application, and does not meet the test-optional admissions requirement, an official ACT or SAT test result will be required.
- Official high school transcripts* are requested to verify high school graduation and to check for exemption from EIU's foreign language graduation requirement.
- *Transcripts are only official when sent directly from parent institution to Eastern.

30 SEMESTER HOURS FROM EIU

• 30 must be taken in the junior and senior years.

• 12 must be taken during the senior year.

• All college-level credit, including electives, count toward these 120 hours.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

• Successfully complete two semesters in a single foreign

language. Students may be exempt from this requirement based on foreign language taken while in high school or at their previous colleges.

• Two years in a single foreign language in high school with a "C" average

• Second semester of a single foreign language in college with a passing grade

• A transferable degree does not exempt a student from this requirement.

• A student receiving a "D" or "F" grade in English or speech will have to repeat the course.

HOUSING

- Apply for on-campus housing through your MyEIU Account.
- No action is required if you are living off-campus. Begin your housing search at least 6 months prior to enrollment.

REGISTER

• Register for **Orientation** through your MyEIU account.

O Complete the online **D2L course** in order to connect with your Academic Advisor and receive advisement on your first semester of courses prior to orientation.

O Online students will receive an email from their Academic Advisor through their Panthermail account to begin the registration process.

O Move into your residence hall or apartment one week before classes begin.

• Attend **Welcome Weekend** and the second portion of Orientation the week before classes begin.

O Pick up textbooks at our **Textbook Rental Service** before classes begin. Books are mailed to online students.
