Eastern Illinois University Transfer Admission and Advisement Guidelines 2018-2019

Admission Requirements

- 1. There is no minimum number of hours required to transfer.
- 2. A transfer student with 24 semester hours or more must have a "C" average (2.0 out of a 4.0) cumulative from all college credit and at least a "C" average from the last institution attended.
- 3. A transfer student with less than 24 semester hours with a 2.0/4.0 must meet the college requirement of a "C" average from the last institution attended and they must also meet one of the following criteria:

ACT 18 or SAT 960 or old SAT 860* AND High School GPA of 2.5

* SAT Exams taken prior to March 2016

Transfer Agreements

- 1. A transfer student who is transferring to Eastern with any Baccalaureate-Oriented Associates degree from an Illinois public community college, Lincoln College, or Springfield College are guaranteed at least 60 semester hours in transfer credit, junior status, and all lower division general education requirements met.
- 2. Students may complete any general education requirements at EIU that were not completed as part of their associates degree.
- 3. Eastern is a participant in the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI), a statewide agreement that allows transfer of the completed Illinois General Education Core Curriculum between participating institutions. Transfer students who complete the 37 to 41 semester-hour package of the IAI from any participating college or university in Illinois will be guaranteed all lower division EIU general education requirements completed, the cultural diversity requirement will be met unless seeking a teaching certificate, and the Constitution course will not be required unless seeking a teaching certificate. (For more information visit www.iTransfer.org)

Acceptance of Credit

- 1. Eastern accepts all college credit from regionally accredited institutions with the exception of courses that are remedial, developmental, or orientation in nature.
- 2. Eastern accepts CLEP and/or CEEB Advanced Placement credit provided official test scores are sent and meet Eastern's standards as set by the appropriate department. All scores need to be sent from the testing agency to the EIU Records Office.
- 3. There is no maximum number of hours that can be accepted; however, the following graduation requirements must be completed:
 - a. 120 semester hours with all general education and major requirements completed;
 - b. 40 semester hours of upper division (junior/senior level) courses;
 - c. 42 semester hours taken in Eastern (may include off-campus courses taught by EIU faculty); and
 - d. 42 semester hours at a Senior Level (4-year) Institution.

Optional Catalog

An undergraduate transfer student may choose to graduate under the requirements stated in the EIU catalog at the time he/she initially enrolled at another college provided that catalog does not precede his/her enrollment at EIU by more than three years.

EIU General Education

LANGUAGE: (LG) 9 semester hours

The requirement is three courses: two in reading and writing and one in listening and speaking. These courses are graded "A", "B", "C", "N/C" (no credit). These courses will only be accepted if they were completed with a "C" or higher.

MATHEMATICS: (MA) 3 semester hours

Please see the substitution list for appropriate general education math courses.

SCIENTIFIC AWARENESS: 7-8 semester hours

The requirement is at least one course in the biological sciences (BS) and one in the physical sciences (PS). At least one course must have a lab.

HUMANITIES & FINE ARTS: 9 semester hours

The student must successfully complete at least one course from humanities (HU), one from fine arts (FA), and one course from either humanities or fine arts.

SOCIAL & BEHAVIORAL SCIENCE: (SB) 9 semester hours

Two of the three courses must be from different disciplines. An American Government/ Constitution course is required for students in Education.

SENIOR SEMINAR: 3 semester hours

To be completed after transfer to Eastern.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: (FL) 0-8 semester hours

The requirement is the completion of the second course in the elementary sequence: 1102 Students are exempt if they have 2 years of high school with "C" average.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY: (D – Diverse) or (N or N/W – Non-Western) 3 semester hours

Students are required to complete a culturally diverse course within one of their general education groupings. These courses can fulfill both the culturally diverse requirement as well as a requirement for another general education area. A culturally diverse course is not needed if IAI or AA/ASA is completed prior to transfer unless the student is an education major.

WRITING COMPETENCY:

All students are required to participate in an Electronic Writing Portfolio made up of essays submitted in writing intensive courses.

- a. 3 essays are required of all students regardless of number of hours transferred.
- b. Essay can be from any course taken at EIU.
- c. Transfer Students are encouraged to submit at least one essay their first semester at EIU.

Associate Degree Benefits

Transfer students who receive a baccalaureate-oriented associates degree from any regionally accredited institution will be guaranteed the following:

- A minimum of 60 semester hours in transfer credit;
- Junior status;
- All lower division EIU general education requirements are automatically waived; and
- The cultural diversity requirement and the constitution requirements are automatically waived (unless pursuing teaching certificate).

*Students who transfer to Eastern without baccalaureate-oriented associates degree or the IAI GECC will have their transfer credit evaluated on a course by course basis. Courses will be placed into the comparable general education and major requirements listed in the EIU catalog the student chooses. Students may also finish the IAI GECC at EIU.

*Students will still, however, have to meet the foreign language requirement if they are not exempt with high school work. (Foreign language is a graduation requirement)

Teacher Assessment Support Center (TASC)

Special Requirements for Majors

Students may declare any major after initial admission to EIU.

However, students may need to meet departmental criteria to advance in their area of study.

The majors below have requirements that are in addition to EIU general admission.

- ❖ Art: a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 and a minimum major GPA of 2.75. For graduation, all Art majors require the completion of the foundation courses (ART 1000, 1001, 1110, 1111, 250, 2601G, 2602G, 2749)
- Athletic Training restricts the number of students who may participate by requiring them to meet specific selection criteria:
 - (1) Must be enrolled as a Kinesiology & Sports Studies Major;
 - (2) Minimum Professional GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale;
 - (3) Minimum Cumulative GPA of a 2.75 on a 4.0 scale:
 - (4) Completion of KSS 2130 and KSS 2135 with an A or B;
 - (5) Successful completion of a performance assessment of two basic injury evaluations;
 - (6) Completion of 100-150 hrs clinical observation under Licensed EIU certified Athletic Trainer;
 - (7) Completion of the Basic Athletic Training Skill Requirements;
 - (8) Completion of the ATEP application;
 - (9) Submission of official transcripts of all college course work completed to date.
 - *In the event that there are too many applicants a point system will be utilized to ensure that all applicants receive a fair opportunity to be accepted into the ATEP.
- ❖ Business: All programs in the School of Business [Accounting, Business Administration (only online or at Parkland College), Finance, Management, Management Information Systems, and Marketing] Business majors must have a minimum grade of "C" or better in prerequisite courses to take certain upper level Business courses.
- ❖ Clinical Laboratory Sciences: This cooperative degree program includes three years of college work followed by completion of a one-year program in clinical laboratory science at an affiliated hospital. The clinical hours taken at the affiliated hospital will be treated as courses taken at EIU counting in residency hours and will be included in EIU grade point average. EIU cannot guarantee admission to any of its affiliated hospitals, but to be assured of serious consideration for acceptance by one of the affiliated schools, the student should have achieved a minimum cumulative and major grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale). EIU has an excellent record of placement of qualified students into the hospital programs.
- ❖ Communication Disorders and Sciences requires students to meet criteria for degree admission that include a 2.5 cumulative GPA and a minimum major GPA of 2.75. Those GPAs must be maintained to register for subsequent upper-division CDS courses. In the CDS major, students earn their professional credentials at the graduate level.
- **Communication Studies** minimum grade of "C" in core courses.
- **Economics** requires a 2.25 GPA in Economics course work with at least six semester hours of Economics earned for admission to the program.
- **Engineering** requires three years of study at EIU followed by two more years at UIUC or SIU-C.
- **English** minimum grade of "C" in core courses
- **Family and Consumer Sciences** requires students to complete 15 hours of college-level work with a minimum cumulative GPA or 2.0 to be admitted and minimum grade of "C" in core courses.
- ❖ General Studies major is designed to meet the educational goals of mature adults in a format and structure compatible with adult responsibilities. Students must meet regular admission requirements to the University and are admitted to this program only through the School of Continuing Education.

- ❖ Graphic Design Admission to the program is limited to those students who have satisfied the specific course requirements (ART 1000, 1001, 1110, 1111, 2050, 2500, 2560, 2601G, 2602G, 2910, 2920, ENG 1001G and 1002G), have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 for all coursework, and a minimum GPA of 2.75 for all Art coursework, and submit an art and design portfolio.
- **Health Administration** requires 15 semester hours of credit to be completed with a minimum 2.0 GPA. Minimum major GPA required for graduation is 2.5. All core required courses need to be completed with a grade of "C" or better.
- **Health Communication** requires 15 semester hours of credit to be completed with a minimum 2.0 GPA. Minimum major GPA required for graduation is 2.5.
- **Health Promotion** requires 15 semester hours of credit to be completed with a minimum 2.0 GPA. Minimum major GPA required for graduation is 2.5. All core required courses need to be completed with a grade of "C" or better.
- **❖ History Education** requires a minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA
- **❖ Journalism** minimum grade of "C" in core courses
- Kinesiology & Sports Studies: Exercise Science Completion of BIO 2210 (or equivalent) with a grade of C or better; Completion of KSS 1500 and KSS 2440 (or equivalent) with a grade of C or better.
 Sports Management Completion of KSS 1500 and KSS 2440 (or equivalent) with a grade of C or better
- **❖ Language Arts Teacher Certification** requires a minimum grade of "C" in core courses; and a minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA
- ❖ Music majors must audition; minimum grade of "C" in core courses
- Non-Business Majors A student pursuing a major other than one resulting in the B.S. in Business cannot count more than 30 semester hours of business subjects toward fulfillment of bachelor's degree requirements.
- Pre-Nursing students planning to attend a nursing program to prepare for registered nurse licensure can take prenursing courses at EIU prior to transfer to another college or university.
- ❖ Psychology major admission requires students to complete MAT 1271 (or a higher level math course) with a "C" or better or earn ACT mathematics sub-score of 26 or higher, in addition to earning at least a "C" in PSY 1879G or its equivalent; minimum grade of "C" in core courses
- * RN to BS in Nursing Program Admission requires admission to EIU, RN license, minimum GPA of 2.5, CPR certification, two professional letters of reference, two-step TB testing, Immunizations, professional statement and completed application to the program.
- Social Science Teaching requires a 3.0 major GPA and a 2.75 cumulative GPA.
- **Sociology** requires a 2.0 average GPA in the core courses.
- ❖ Teacher education majors and options require a *minimum* cumulative GPA of 2.65 and a "C" or better in all courses used towards graduation, regardless of where they are taken. This includes general education, professional education, major and courses, all University required courses and electives. Teacher licensure for English, History and Social Science Teaching requires a minimum cumulative GPA of a 2.75.
- **❖ Theatre Arts** minimum grade of "C" in core courses

Admission to the CDS Major:

Students entering EIU as Freshman or Transfer seeking a CDS degree will be classified as probational CDS majors. Probational majors may register for all lower division (2999 or lower) courses in the CDS major.

Access to all upper division CDS courses requires admission to the CDS Major. The Department Chair reviews the applications of all probational CDS majors seeking admission to the major. The chair determines if the student's academic achievement supports admission to the major and access to upper division course.

Criteria for Admission:

- Classification as a probational CDS major
- Achievement of a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher for all EIU course work

NOTES:

This major requires that all students (including transfer students from community colleges or senior institutions) follow and meet the requirements for Admission, Retention and Graduation from Teacher Licensure programs as explained at the University Admission to Teacher Education Meeting which all students must attend. Additional information on Admission, Retention and Graduation for Teacher Licensure programs can be found on the College of Education website at www.eiu.edu/ceps/teached.

All students must pass the Illinois Licensure Test of Academic Proficiency or document a composite score of 22 or higher, with combined Writing score of 6, on the ACT plus Writing; or combined SAT of 1110 with Writing/Language sub score of 26 for selection into teacher education and should complete this requirement no later than their sophomore year.

Students must receive a "C" or better in all courses used toward graduation, regardless of where they are taken. This includes general education, professional education, major and minor course, all university required courses, and electives. Students must maintain a minimum cumulative and major GPA of 2.65 in order to continue in the program.

While all of Eastern Illinois University's teacher education programs are approved by the Illinois State Board of Education, only the State can issue a teaching license. All licensure programs are subject to change to follow requirements of the Illinois State Board of Education and the Department of Teaching, Learning and Foundations.

This major requires that all students (including transfer students from community colleges or senior institutions) follow and meet the requirements for Admission, Retention and Graduation from Teacher Licensure programs as explained at the University Admission to Teacher Education Meeting which all students must attend. All students must pass the Illinois Licensure Test of Academic Proficiency or document a composite score of 22 or higher, with combined Writing score of 6, on the ACT plus Writing; or combined SAT of 1110 with Writing/Language sub score of 26 for selection into teacher education and should complete this requirement no later than their sophomore year.

Students must receive a "C" or better in all courses used toward graduation, regardless of where they are taken. This includes general education, professional education, major and minor course, all university required courses, and electives. Students must maintain a minimum cumulative and major GPA of 2.65 in order to continue in the program.

Engineering (B.S.)

This cooperative degree program, administered by the Pre-Engineering Studies Committee, requires about three years of work at EIU followed by two years of work at either the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) or Southern Illinois University at Carbondale (SIUC). It is designed to provide engineering students with a broader base of liberal arts that is usually given in a four-year curriculum. Upon completion of the program, the student receives a Bachelor of Science degree from EIU and a Bachelor of Science in Engineering degree from UIUC or SIUC. Interested students should consult with the Chairperson of the Pre-Engineering Studies Committee for detailed requirements of the program.

After completing 60 semester hours in this curriculum, a student may apply to the Pre-Engineering Studies Committee for admission as an engineering candidate. General Studies (B.A.)

The Bachelor of Arts in General Studies Degree Completion Program (BGS) is specifically designed to meet the educational goals of mature adults in a format and structure compatible with adult responsibilities.

It is recommended that applicants have a minimum of 30 semester hours of transfer credit. We will accept up to 100 hours of transfer credit, including as many as 78 from a community college.

As an adult-student friendly degree program, the BGS program provides learners with the opportunity to have their life experiences evaluated for college-level learning. Assessment of prior learning is valuable to the adult learner as it validates knowledge gained outside the traditional classroom. It can save students time and money by decreasing the number of required courses needed for degree completion. Prior learning may be awarded for military experience, passing proficiency exams or through a prior learning portfolio. Your academic advisor will work with you to determine your options.

To graduate with a Bachelor of Arts in General Studies degree, a student must complete 120 semester hours of credit which include:

- 40 semester hours at the junior/senior level.
- 20 semester hours earned from Eastern Illinois University (via on-campus, off-campus or distance learning courses).
- 12 semester hours of credit in Scientific Awareness/Mathematics
- 12 semester hours of credit in Social/Behavioral Science
- 12 semester hours of credit in Humanities/Fine Arts
- 6 semester hours of Communication/Language
- 3 semester hours of Senior Seminar
- 1 course in Cultural Diversity.

- BGS 3002 Critical Thinking and the Adult Learner
- BGS 4001 Self-Directed Leadership
- Meet Writing Competency Requirement (Electronic Writing Portfolio)

This major requires that all students (including transfer students from community colleges or senior institutions) follow and meet the requirements for Admission, Retention and Graduation from Teacher Licensure programs as explained at the University Admission to Teacher Education Meeting which all students must attend. Additional information on Admission, Retention and Graduation for Teacher Licensure programs can be found on the College of Education website at www.eiu.edu/ceps/teached.

All students must pass the Illinois Licensure Test of Academic Proficiency or document a composite score of 22 or higher, with combined Writing score of 6, on the ACT plus Writing; or combined SAT of 1110 with Writing/Language sub score of 26 for selection into teacher education and should complete this requirement no later than their sophomore year.

Students must receive a "C" or better in all courses used toward graduation, regardless of where they are taken. This includes general education, professional education, major and minor course, all university required courses, and electives. Students must maintain a minimum cumulative and major GPA of 2.65 in order to continue in the program.

While all of Eastern Illinois University's teacher education programs are approved by the Illinois State Board of Education, only the State can issue a teaching license. All licensure programs are subject to change to follow requirements of the Illinois State Board of Education and the Department of Teaching, Learning and Foundations.

Pre-Chiropractic

This is just a suggested course pattern. Students must work with their advisor to develop a curriculum plan that meets their scheduling needs. Summer classes can also reduce the load during Fall and Spring semesters.

EIU offers coursework in preparation for application to Chiropractic school. Upon completion of these undergraduate prerequisites, students may apply to the chiropractic school of their choice. The admissions requirements of the colleges vary, so it is important to determine the specific requirements of the school of your choice. In general, students should plan to complete a bachelor's degree. Like other post baccalaureate health programs, admission is competitive. A strong GPA (minimum 3.00/4.00 scale in both the sciences and cumulative), along with experience are necessary requirements to gain admission.

Eastern Illinois University has entered into affiliation agreements with Logan College of Chiropractic (LCC) and Palmer College of Chiropractic. This admissions program will allow qualified students to attend Logan or Palmer after 3 years (94 credits) at Eastern and finish a doctor of Chiropractic degree after three more years at the chiropractic programs. Under these agreements, Logan or Palmer College of Chiropractic shall accept students who successfully complete the Pre-Chiropractic Program with a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or higher and meet all other criteria for admission. Upon completion of the first year of studies at Logan or Palmer, a maximum of 34 credits from either program may be transferred back to EIU toward completion of credits required for the Bachelor of Science in Biological Sciences degree at Eastern.

Pre-Dentistry Program

This is just a **suggested** course pattern. Students must work with their advisor to develop a curriculum plan that meets their scheduling needs. Summer classes can also reduce the load during Fall and Spring semesters.

Dentistry is a four-year graduate program. Admission into a dental program is very competitive. Students should maintain a grade point average near 3.50/4.00, acquire leadership skills and exposure to the world of dentistry, and score an 18 or higher on the Dental Admission Test (DAT). Three letters of recommendation are required, typically 2 from the sciences and 1 letter of the student are choosing. Typically the DAT is taken during the Spring Semester of the junior year, and application through a centralized application service Associated American Dental Schools Application Services (AADSAS) is submitted in June between the junior and senior years.

Dental admissions are quite competitive and the vast majority of successful applicants have obtained their baccalaureate degree. Below are the **minimum** requirements to be considered for dental school admission. Dental schools are seeking individuals who are well rounded in their educational background. In selecting a major, identify one that will prepare you best for dental practice or a backup plan. English, biology, chemistry, psychology or psychology with a business minor are a few majors to consider. Because of the manipulative nature of the profession, courses in art and sculpting are also useful.

Pre-Engineering Program

This is just a **suggested** course pattern. Students must work with their advisor to develop a curriculum plan that meets their scheduling needs. Summer classes can also reduce the load during Fall and Spring semesters.

Pre-Engineering at Eastern Illinois University is a program designed to provide the first two years of a four-year Engineering degree. The first two years of most Engineering programs have the same curricula (basic science and math) so transferring from EIU to a 4 year Engineering program is generally a smooth transition.

EIU offers lower cost and a different atmosphere than the 4 year Engineering programs. The smaller class size, faculty teaching lecture and labs, research opportunities, and integrative learning environment set EIU apart from larger schools. The collegial atmosphere leads to a more inviting and collaborative learning environment. Students who might get lost in large lecture halls can quickly become a part of the community at EIU. With a high success rate after transfer to other institutions, our students find that this preparation is completely equivalent to spending all four years at a 4 year Engineering program.

EIU also offers a 3-2 degree in conjunction with either the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) or with Southern Illinois University at Carbondale (SIUC), in which a student takes a third year of liberal arts enrichment at EIU and graduates with a double bachelor's degree- one from EIU and one from either UIUC or SIUC. In this program there are actually two tracks, one where they receive an Engineering Physics degree from EIU and another where they receive a Physics Major from EIU, each of these is in addition to their Engineering Degree from the other institutions.

This two-year program is administered by the Pre-Engineering Studies Committee. Students planning to enroll in pre-engineering are advised to include the following in their high school programs: mathematics—four or more units, including Trigonometry; and Science—three or more units, including chemistry and physics. Students with deficient high school background should expect their graduation with an engineering degree to be delayed.

There are two pre-engineering options: general (appropriate for all except chemical engineering) and chemical. Students interested in the chemical engineering option should consult with the chairperson of the Pre- Engineering Studies Committee. The minimum general pre-engineering requirements are as follows:

Pre-Law Program and Minor

To provide students with guidance in the selection of those courses which will enable them to complete a J.D. at an American Bar Association accredited law school, EIU offers a minor in Pre-Law Studies. This minor will provide students with the following: basic analytical skills, an introduction to the language of the law, and the written communication skills necessary for the study of law. This minor is administered by the Pre-Law Advisor and the Pre-Legal Studies Committee.

All students interested in a career in law should consult with the Pre-Law Advisor (217) 581-2523 (Coleman Hall 2135) for information regarding law school admission requirements.

Students at Eastern are provided with a variety of on-campus services by the Pre-Law Advisor and the Pre-Legal Studies Committee, including information about all the ABA-approved law schools, guest presentations by law school admissions officers and by person who practice law, several scholarships for students who are admitted to law school, field trips to area law schools, Pre-Law Internships, a Pre-Law Club, the Law School Admission Test (administered on campus), a mock Law School Admission Test, LSAT Preparatory Course and advice from the Pre-Law Advisor concerning law school admissions strategies.

Pre-Medicine

This is just a **suggested** course pattern. Students must work with their advisor to develop a curriculum plan that meets their scheduling needs. Summer classes can also reduce the load during Fall and Spring semesters.

Admission into medical school is very competitive. Students should maintain a grade point average near or above 3.50/4.00, acquire leadership skills, exposure to healthcare, and score at least a 27 or higher on the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT). Preparation materials from the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) can be found at https://www.aamc.org/students/applying/mcat/preparing/. Typically the MCAT is taken during the Spring Semester of the junior year, and an application through a centralized application service American Medical College Application Service (AMCAS) is submitted in June between the junior and senior years. Apply Early! At least three letters of recommendation are required, typically 2 from the sciences and 1 letter of the student's choosing.

Below are the requirements to be considered for medical school admission. As long as the requirements are met, identifying an undergraduate major is based completely on the student's interests and goals. Medical schools do not favor any particular major. Most importantly medical schools are seeking individuals who are well rounded in their educational background. Development of a strong vocabulary and communication skills are as important as any particular class.

Pre-Nursing

Eastern Illinois University has a cooperative agreement with Lakeview College of Nursing. After completing 2 years at Eastern Illinois University, the student would then transfer to Lakeview College of Nursing to complete the coursework necessary to satisfy a Baccalaureate in Nursing (BSN). When enrolled at Lakeview, the student will be pay Lakeview tuition, however they may live on the EIU campus and use all of the campus services. Lakeview College of Nursing now requires a minimum 2.50/4.00 prerequisite GPA to be considered for admission. Note that a 2.50 GPA is the **minimum** accepted. **However**, due to the competition, it typically takes a higher GPA to gain admission.

Pre-Occupational Therapy

This is just a **suggested** course pattern. Students must work with their advisor to develop a curriculum plan that meets their scheduling needs. Summer classes can also reduce the load during Fall and Spring semesters.

Occupational therapists help people prepare to re-enter the workplace or merely regain control over their lives. They help patients develop behaviors and modify the workplace or living environment to accommodate disabilities and prevent further injury. As such, they are part psychologist, part sociologist, and part allied health specialist.

Occupational Therapy programs are phasing in master's level degrees rather than the traditional baccalaureate degree. Students enrolled at Eastern who decide to pursue a career in Occupational Therapy should complete a baccalaureate degree in an appropriate major, such as Psychology or Biology, and apply to a graduate program. A 3.50 gpa and a solid performance on the Graduate Record Exam (GRE), taken the summer before senior year, are required. Most programs also require 45+ experience hours with a licensed occupational therapist and three letters of recommendation (1 academic, 1 professional, and 1 of your choice). Each OT program has different requirements, it is very important to identify early which programs you plan to apply and plot out their requirements accordingly.

On average students should maintain a grade point average near 3.40/4.00 or higher, demonstrate leadership skills, expose yourself to the world of optometry, and perform well on the Optometry Admission Test (OAT).

Pre-Pathologist Assistant

This is just a **suggested** course pattern. Students must work with their advisor to develop a curriculum plan that meets their scheduling needs. Summer classes can also reduce the load during Fall and Spring semesters.

Pathologists' assistants (PathAs) provide anatomic pathology services under the direction and supervision of a pathologist. These allied health professionals utilize a variety of manual and automated techniques to process, dissect, stain, etc. tissue samples from patients. Individuals assess the condition of patients for sample procurement, examination, diagnosis, and treatment. Job duties may include coordination of autopsy protocols perform postmortem examinations. They must pass a national certifying examination (American Society for Clinical Pathology, or ASCP) which is open only to graduates of accredited PathA programs.

The preferred PathA degree is at the Masters-level degree based on a curriculum involving both classroom instruction and clinical rotations, usually requiring 1 ½ to 2 years for degree completion. Therefore, most students entering a PathA program have already completed a baccalaureate degree, usually in the sciences. The average entrant has competitive scores on the GRE, and has a minimum grade point average of 3.00/4.00. Attributes such as demonstrated caring attitude toward others, communication skills, emotional stability under stress and problem solving ability are important selection factors.

There are currently 8 NAACLS accredited PathA programs in America. It is very important when you begin your program to identify which programs you plan to apply and plot out their requirements accordingly.

Pre-Pharmacy

Since pharmacy schools admit few, if any, students without a bachelor's degree. Most students desiring the pharmacy degree complete a Bachelor's degree before entering pharmacy school. Programs leading to the BA or the BS degree with a variety of majors are suitable although most students select a major in biological sciences or chemistry. When registering, such students should indicate their choice of degree and major, and declare Pre-Pharmacy as a second major.

Students apply through a central application service one full year before matriculating to a medical school, and should be prepared to take the Pharmacy College Admissions Test (PCAT) during the spring semester of the year in which they are applying; the following minimum requirements should be met by that time.

Pre-Physician Assistant

Physician assistants (PAs) practice medicine under the supervision of licensed physicians, and they are qualified to perform approximately 80% of duties commonly done by primary care physicians. PAs, however, practice in almost all health care settings and in many medical and surgical specialties. They must pass a national certifying examination which is open only to graduates of accredited PA programs.

The preferred PA degree is at the Masters-level degree based on a curriculum involving both classroom instruction and clinical rotations. Therefore, most students entering a PA program have already completed a baccalaureate degree, usually in the sciences. The average entrant has had approximately four years of health care experience (experience is required by many programs see below), competitive scores on the GRE, and has a grade point average of 3.40/4.00. Attributes such as demonstrated caring attitude toward others, communication skills, emotional stability under stress and problem solving ability are important selection factors.

Each PA program has different requirements. It is very important to identify early which programs you plan to apply and plot out their requirements accordingly.

Pre-Physical Therapy

Physical Therapists work with patients to regain mobility and strength after accidents or injury. Training to become a physical therapist requires a doctorate consisting of 2-3 years of training beyond the baccalaureate degree. A Bachelor of Science in Biological Sciences includes most of the physical therapy (PT) prerequisites; however, any academic baccalaureate degree will be acceptable that includes these prerequisites. The Graduate Record Exam (GRE) is required for entry into most PT programs. To be accepted into a PT program, a GPA of at least 3.4 on a 4.0 scale and high GRE scores are needed. Most programs also require 45+ job shadowing/experiential hours in the health care field (preferably PT). Each PA program has different requirements. It is very important to identify early which programs you plan to apply and plot out their requirements accordingly.

Pre-Podiatry

The student then applies to a Doctor of Podiatric Medicine (DPM) degree at a professional college of podiatry. Admission is very competitive and each podiatry program has slightly different criteria. It is important to review the prerequisites for each school and identify which program you wish to apply and plan accordingly. On average students should maintain a grade point average near 3.40/4.00 or higher, demonstrate leadership skills, expose yourself to the world of podiatry, and perform well on the Medical Admission Test (MCAT).

Pre-Veterinary Medicine

Admission into veterinary school is very competitive. Although many of the veterinary medical college do not require a bachelor's degree for entrance, most students admitted will have completed a bachelor's degree. Students should maintain a grade point average near or above 3.50/4.00, acquire leadership skills, extensive/diverse experience in veterinary medicine, and obtain 63% on the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) to be competitive. Students apply through a centralized application service *Veterinary Medical College Application Service* (VMCAS) in June between the junior and senior years. Apply Early! At least three letters of recommendation are required, typically 1 from a college instructor and 1 from a veterinarian. The last letter can be from the student's choosing. Each of the 28 veterinary programs have different requirements, it is very important to identify early which programs you plan to apply and plot out their requirements accordingly.

Special Education (B.S. in Education) Licensure Programs Leading to Multiple Endorsements

Early Childhood Special Education and Early Childhood Education:

Any student desiring to add an endorsement for Early Childhood Education may do so by supplementing the Special Education Early Childhood Option with the aid of an academic advisor in the Department of Special Education. In order to do so, the student will be required to complete course requirements in the area of Early Childhood Education.

Special Education and Elementary Education:

Any student desiring to earn the Elementary Education [1-5(6) Illinois] endorsement in addition to the Standard Special (PK-21 Illinois) endorsement may do so by supplementing the Standard Special Option with the aid of an academic advisor in the Department of Special Education. Student will be required to complete Elementary Education course work and additional general education requirements.

Special Education and Secondary Education:

Any student desiring to earn a High School (9-12 Illinois) endorsement in addition to the Standard Special (PK-21 Illinois) endorsement may do so by supplementing the Standard Special Option with the aid of an academic advisor in the Department of Special Education. A minimum of 32 semester hours in an Academic area is required. Academic Areas possible include Art, Math, Music Education, Spanish, Career and Technical Education (Business Education, Family and Consumer Sciences or Technology Education).
