

## 1. Reorganizing how we present academic programs to prospective students

- With 2 clicks, our current website provides a list of majors or departments by academic structure, lacking integration and context.
- Change the webpage to a 1 click academic site focusing on interest areas and careers.
- Departments submit keywords to develop the interest areas, determine which interest areas their programs should fall under, and are encouraged to list their programs in multiple areas.

## 2. Reorganizing the college structure

- Why change the organization?
  - Enhance recruitment
  - Save money
  - Improve access to resources, possibly easier accreditation process
  - Better express who we are and what we value
- We are studying three options:
  - Option 1: Don't change anything.
  - Option 2: Five academic colleges:
    - Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences
    - Science & Technology
    - Health & Human Services (CDS, FCS, HST, KSS, NUR and REC)
    - Business
    - Education
  - Option 3: Four academic colleges
    - Arts & Sciences
    - Education
    - Business & Technology
    - Health & Human Services
- Additional issues: Should BGS and OPD move under the College of Graduate School & Professional Studies?
- Should we create a University College for undergraduate academic services and Honors?

- Does every college require an associate dean?
- Should UPI and the administration change the CU system to encourage team-taught courses?
- Can we establish faculty groups across career/interest areas to sustain conversations about curriculum and innovation?
